I am always amazed at the Christmas story of God becoming a man. *It is "Still The Greatest Story Ever Told."* No matter how much the world pushes Santa Claus and commercializes this time of the year, the fact that Christ was born to die for you and I still stops men in their tracks and changes lives. It says in **Hebrews 10: 12-13**, But this man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God; from henceforth expecting till His enemies be made His footstool. As I think on these verses, my mind goes to the thought of man being

chained by sin with no hope of ever being set free. But God, who is rich in mercy, offers His life and the sin factor is broken. Elijah is going to be taken up by the Lord at any moment. At one point before Elijah is caught up in a whirlwind into heaven by a chariot of fire, he asked Elisha, what shall I do for thee? The reply of the young prophet was, let a double portion of thy Spirit be upon me. Elijah said, you ask a hard thing but if you see me when I go, then your request shall be so. You know the story. Elijah is taken; Elisha sees him go and Elijah's mantle falls on Elisha. This looks like Christ and the Church. Elisha didn't stop and admire the mantle and see how good it looked on him.
