Then spake Jesus again unto them saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life. John 8:12 Light is an amazing thing; light travels at 700,000,000 miles an hour. It can cut rock, steal and destroy the world's most feared weapons by the power of a laser. The greatest thing about light in a person's life is that it enables them to see. Without light it is all darkness and we know you can't do much in the dark. The most dangerous time while driving is the time between total darkness and total light called twilight or dusk. It is at this time people mistake shadows for substance. A lot of people have a little night-light in the hallway in their house at night to help them see so they can make it to the restroom without turning the lights on. These work fine until maybe one of the kids has left a toy truck or roller-skate in the hallway and you don't see it and step on it then fall and hurt yourself. You didn't see the toy in the middle of the hallway because the light was too dim. This has happened in the church world. Sinners come into the church and because the light is so dim, they stumble around and fall out the back door and never make it back. One testimony from a dear woman was that her daughter did not want to go to church with her because she could go to this other church, get drunk on Saturday night and on Sunday they didn't make her feel bad about it. I ask you this question. How much light is in that church? You may say well we just don't want to condemn anyone. You may say Jesus never condemned anyone so I don't either.

If that is the scripture you stand on, then you must read on because the Bible says he that believeth not is condemned already. Man is already condemned to hell and needs light to expose the darkness. If you go to the hospital for surgery, in the operating room you will see lights above the operating table. Those lights expose to the doctor everything he looks at. He or she can see to do their work on the patient. The Bible says that the light of the gospel exposes men's heart. Romans 1:16 says, For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. The gospel is the power of God unto salvation. The reason there is very little power in the church is because there is very little gospel. The gospel is the power of God; power to set the captive free, power to heal marriages, power to heal the sick and power to save the lost. In Acts Chapter 2 we read about the Holy Ghost coming to those in the upper room. In verse 2 there is the word suddenly. The Bible says and suddenly. Five minutes to nine in the morning nothing but at nine o'clock; suddenly the wind blew and the Holy Ghost came and filled the house and all those in that house. Now Peter an ignorant and unlearned fisherman who just a few weeks before was a coward and denied the Lord three times; stood up and preached the gospel that exposed the hearts of those outside and three thousand people were born into the kingdom of God because the light had come. Today we preach ten days, pray ten minutes and nothing happens. They prayed ten days, Peter preached ten minutes and three thousand were born again.
